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St. Mary's Catholic Primary School Homework Policy

Learning at home is an essential part of good education. Regular homework is important as it gives pupils the opportunity to practice at home the tasks covered in class, and helps the pupils work towards improving important skills. It also helps children to become confident and independent in their learning, which will support them throughout their school and adult life.

At St. Mary's Catholic Primary School, homework is defined as out of school tasks set for children as an extension of their class work. Homework is for practice, preparation and reinforcement.

Purpose

- to encourage independent learning skills
- to create additional time for structured learning
- to bridge the gap between home and school
- to develop a more effective partnership between school and parents

Practice

- The setting of homework for children will be according to the homework timetable. The
 frequency and length of the tasks will vary according to the age and ability of the child, and
 according to the programme of work at the time.
- Tasks may include, amongst others, reading and spelling, maths activities including the learning of tables, extension of work begun in school, additional research, projects, collecting information, investigations.
- Homework will be set for clearly defined purposes, based on the learning within the class.
- Children will be expected to apply the same high standards to homework as they would to class work.
- Homework in the form of worksheets, work books or text books will not be provided for absent children; for example, children who are out of school for a family holiday or for periods of sickness. If a child wishes to undertake additional work, we will encourage them to do personal research on the topics covered within the class.
- Homework is monitored; if a child regularly fails to return homework or if homework is
 consistently handed in late discussions will be held with the child's parents to ascertain the
 reasons and what can be done to support the child in the completion of the homework tasks.
 On occasions, the completion of a Homework task will not be possible due to other
 commitments; this is recognised and will be accepted.
- Homework should not impact negatively on family life.









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Responsibilities

- Children are responsible for collecting, completing and returning their homework on time.
- Parents are responsible for ensuring that their children have completed their homework satisfactorily and to the required standard.
- Teachers are responsible for setting and marking homework on a regular basis in accordance with the homework timetable.

Communication

- Homework will be explained to the children and where appropriate additional information will be given to the parents including information on duration and deadlines. Homework will be given to children on a Thursday and will need to be handed in by the following Tuesday
- This policy can be distributed to parents on request, along with a homework timetable at the beginning of each school year
- Each child will have a communication book that can be used to write notes and information between home and school.
- The class teacher is available to discuss concerns parents may have regarding homework.
