Pick some of these activities to support our learning in Religious Education.

<p style="text-align: center;">Holy Week</p> <p>Create a comic strip which outlines the events of Holy Week.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Palm Sunday - Maundy Thursday (this could include the Last Supper, washing of the feet and Jesus' arrest) - Good Friday - Easter Sunday 	<p style="text-align: center;">The raising of Lazarus</p> <p>In <i>John 11:1-43</i>, we hear about Jesus visiting friends, a journey which ends in death and resurrection.</p> <p>Read the scripture and create an interview with some of the eyewitnesses. Who? What? Where? How?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Paschal Candle</p> <p>Research what the Paschal Candle is and what is written on it.</p> <p>Create a poster with an image and annotate the meanings of the inscriptions.</p> <p>You can then design your own!</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Jerusalem Times</p> <p>Create a newspaper report about the death of Jesus.</p> <p>Use <i>John 19: 16-42</i> to make notes on the events.</p> <p>Ensure you write about the key facts and events, including the feelings and experiences felt.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Get baking!</p> <p>Jesus declared, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty." <i>John 6:35</i></p> <p>Bake some bread and discuss the meaning of the bread of life e.g. mould, rise, shape, feed etc.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Easter Vigil</p> <p>The Easter Vigil takes place on Holy Saturday night, as late as possible. It is a celebration of Jesus' new life and his resurrection.</p> <p>Plan a collective worship with this theme.</p> <p>Remember: Gather, Listen, Respond and Mission.</p>
